## CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

Our *12th Annual Winter Conference on Pediatric Emergencies* focuses on many challenges facing Pediatric and Emergency physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and nurses involved in the clinical care of children. The goal of this conference is to increase participants' knowledge of recent advances in pediatric emergency medicine and to enhance their competence in managing common pediatric emergencies. Participants will be able to update and apply their knowledge and skills immediately to clinical practice through participation in lectures, case presentations and discussions about illnesses and injuries specific to the pediatric population.

Topics for this year's conference have been selected based on extensive target audience needs assessment data resulting from professional practice gaps. These gaps are identified by a variety of sources including feedback and evaluations from past participants, clinical expert input, Symposia Medicus' online survey, and other medical and nursing data.
